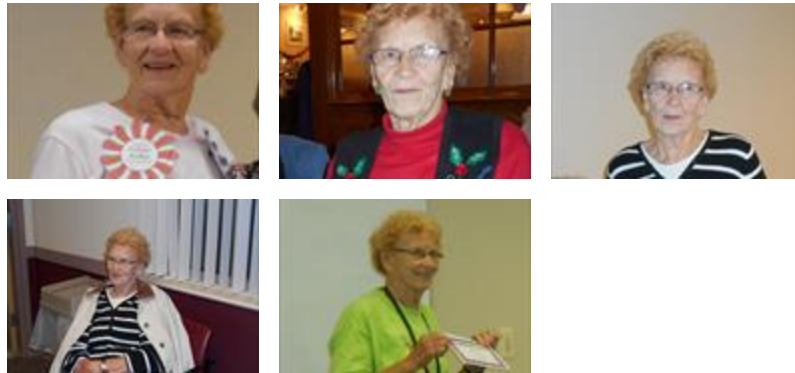

May the family and friends of Colene Hadley find peace in their memories during this difficult time.

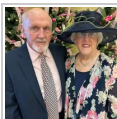
